Park Entry Permit

A valid Nebraska Park Entry Permit is required for all vehicles, except government vehicles, and can be purchased at the park office.

Food Service

The Fort Robinson Inn and Lodge will be open for breakfast on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, Friday and Saturday lunches are included in the registration fee. The Friday and Saturday evening meals are additional charges.

Accommodations

Registrants will have the opportunity to stay on the grounds of historic Fort Robinson. Limited lodging has been reserved in the following historic structures:

The Lodge

Facilities include the park office, Fort Robinson Inn restaurant, and 22 rooms with private baths.

Cabin Adobes (1874-75 and 1887 Officers' Quarters)

Each duplex half has baths, kitchen, utensils, dishes, and linens. Number of beds varies.

Comanche Hall (1909 Bachelor Officers' Quarters)

Rooms for one to eight persons.

Electrical hookups and shower/latrine facilities are available.
